Vanessa and JR Ford didn't know their youngest child was a girl until she told them on her fourth birthday. "Mom, I'm not a boy," she said. "I'm a girl in my heart and in my brain." As the parents of a transgender daughter, Vanessa and JR are at the epicenter of today's changing terrain when it comes to gender. The Fords are just one of the families featured in my new documentary, Gender Revolution: A Journey With Katie Couric. In this companion podcast, Brian and I dive deep with the Fords and two others featured in Gender Revolution: Georgiann Davis, a sociologist and intersex activist, and Dr. Joshua Safer, who runs the Center for Transgender Medicine and Surgery at Boston Medical Center.

Gender Identity and Gender Expression Update

- All school codes of conduct have been updated as per the requirement of the ministry's anti-bullying policies
- All schools have been provided a copy of the Gender Identity and Gender Expression Policy & Regulation 4305
- All schools have been asked to create an archive for GSA notes and agendas and to build collections of resources that address gender identity and gender expression. New resources are sent to schools on a regular basis and as they are received
- A survey of the needs of each school, based on the new policy and regulation, was completed
- A facilities plan is being developed to align all schools with the new policy and regulation and includes such items as change rooms and washrooms

- SOGI Inclusive Education goals and best practices for creating more inclusive environments for all students have been shared with all schools

- All schools have been asked to identify a Safe Contact person
- All schools have been instructed to use the preferred pronouns and names requested by staff and students
