- Welcome and Introductions Name, School, Preferred Pronouns - Harold reminded everyone how important it is to respect preferred pronouns. We will make mistakes and it is ok as long as we are willing to acknowledge and support; we will get there together.
- 2. School Updates Hello Guys, Gals and Non-binary Pals 😊
 - a. Esquimalt Rainbow Week included a big dance in the foyer of the theatre that was well received.
 Pride Victoria provided some amazing prizes. On Saturday a group of GSA students attended MP Randall Garrison's luncheon.
 - b. Rockheights Every morning of Rainbow Week began with morning announcements. Posters were used to celebrate/educate and Library Resources were displayed and used. Nine students in grades 7 & 8 did interactive presentations to each classroom and included a survey on exposure to anti-LGBTQ language; everyone has been exposed to this language at some time. How do we make Rockheights a safe place? T-shirts representing the colours of the rainbow were worn.
 - c. Cedar Hill members submitted work to the Middle School Social Justice Art Gallery and walked to the gallery to see other works representing Equality,

Acceptance and Love. The group is working on a video for next year to involve more students. A \$250 grant was given to them by Saanich Recreation to support their club. The money will be used to purchase art supplies and maybe t-shirts. An end of year event is planned that includes face painting and tattoos.

- d. Willows Post it notes in different colours were used to send positive messages during Rainbow Week.
- e. Lambrick Park A number of our LGBTQ students attended the recent YCI Camp and MP Randall Garrison's Luncheon. Lots of activities were organized for Rainbow Week which included morning announcements, Pride & Transgender flag displays, rainbow cookies handed out to supporters, and a display during Transition Day that included information cards for services in the community. The group has reworked the LGBTQ pamphlet to update it.
- f. Sir James Douglas During Rainbow Week, the school built the rainbow throughout the week with one colour at a time. There were a number of excellent books as resources available in the Library and the Teacher Librarian was happy to share. Please contact Murray if you are interested in the titles of these new books for your library.
- g. Trustee's Report Jordan shared that the Reimagining Masculinities event was well attended with student tickets being funded. The dress code has passed and we will now begin the conversations on implementation. Our students continue to be leaders and we need to share with others.
- 3. Gender Ally <u>www.onmyplanet.ca</u> Harold shared the Gender Ally information. This was also sent to all SOGI Leads in schools and is an excellent resource.

4. Pride Parade Planning - This year's PRIDE Parade will be held on Sunday, July 8th. The event starts at 11 am and we are typically waiting on Government Street south of the McPherson Theatre starting at 10:30. This event is a non-supervised event and those attending will make their own way to and from the parade.
