Eye See ... Eye Learn® Participation Form



Eye See ... Eye Learn® (ESEL) is a children's vision program created by the BC Doctors of Optometry (BCDO). The mission of ESEL is to detect, diagnose, and treat kindergarten children with vision problems so that every child in kindergarten can see and learn to the best of their ability.

To spot vision problems, ask the following:

Does the child...

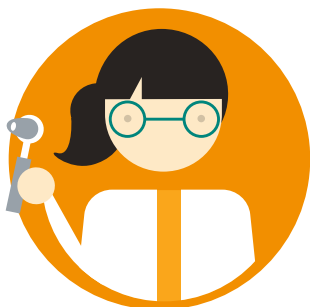
- Usually have watery eyes?
- Have crusty eyelids?
- Rub eyes frequently?
- Have frequent eye infections or styes?
- Turn or tilt head, or cover or close one eye, when looking at things?
- Blink more than normal?
- Have frequent headaches, double vision, or eye strain?
- Lose place, skip lines, or use finger to keep place when reading?
- Have head movements more than normal when reading?
- Have poor hand-eye coordination?
- Have trouble recognizing letters and numbers?
- Reverse letters and words when reading or writing?
- Have handwriting and drawing skills that are not at the expected level?
- Squint when looking at things?
- Confuse words with similar beginnings?
- Respond well in speaking, but have trouble putting the same information down on paper?

Any one, or a combination, of the above signs may indicate a vision problem. Children rarely complain of vision problems since they don't realize that they see the world differently than others. In fact, vision problems are often mistaken as other developmental problems like dyslexia or ADHD. A comprehensive eye exam is the only way to detect all eye problems.

How Can I Participate in ESEL?

It's simple!

1. Check above to find out your eligibility

2. Book an appointment with an ESEL clinic

To find an ESEL clinic, visit www.bcesel.ca and use our 'Find A Doctor' tool. Make sure you select 'Eye See ... Eye Learn®' under 'Programs'.

3. Fill in the ESEL Participation Form and bring it to your appointment

Parents/Guardians of kindergarten children can either fill in the ESEL Participation Form or bring relevant documentation that the child is enrolled in kindergarten.

How Long Does ESEL Run For?

ESEL runs alongside the school calendar, though the program is available for one full year. The official start date of the program is on September 1 and the end date is on August 31 of the following year. For example, the 2019/2020 program will run from September 1, 2019 until August 31, 2020.
